### Things to do with a Car

1. The Dingle Peninsula has to be one of the most scenic drives for any traveller with the views from the Conor Pass and Slea Head being some of the most breathtaking in Kerry.
2. Killarney National Park offers visitors the McGillicuddy Reeks, Ireland's highest mountain range, Muckross House & Gardens, Torc Waterfall, the Killarney Lakes and many species of wildlife including the famous Irish Red & Sika Deer.

5. Go Shopping! Visit Manor West Retail Park for array of shops from Debenhams to Next, Smyths Toys to Harvey Normans (definitely something there fro all the family!!)
